Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Delist Notice

The Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Program (the State Superfund Program) is the State's program for identifying, investigating, and cleaning up sites where the disposal of hazardous waste may present a threat to public health and/or the environment. The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (Department) maintains a list of these sites in the Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Sites (the "Registry"). The Department has determined that this site ([see map on reverse side](#)) no longer presents a threat to public health or the environment and is proposing to delist the site from the Registry for the following reason(s):

- Hazardous waste disposal at this site was investigated and addressed by implementation of a remedial program. The site has been properly closed and capped. Subsequent sampling determined that contamination was not emanating from the landfill or sludge drying bed. No off-site contamination has been identified. Surrounding homes and businesses are serviced by public water. Remediation occurred prior to the Site Investigation as such, no Record of Decision was issued. The site was assigned a classification of "5" in 1994. The site does not represent significant threat to public health and environment. An Environmental Notice was placed on the site on November 26, 2013 restricting it to industrial use, managing the contaminated soil in the event the asphalt cover is breached and prohibiting use of ground water without proper treatment.

Public comments are being received before the decision to remove the site from the Registry is finalized. The public comment period will end March 16, 2014. If we do not receive any new or additional information during this public comment period that changes our delist proposal, we will delist the site on or after April 15, 2014.


