Cleanup Action to Begin at Hancock Air National Guard Base

Action is about to begin that will address the soil contamination related to two former firing ranges at the NY Air National Guard, Hancock Field site ("site") located at 6001 East Malloy Road, Dewitt, Onondaga County under The Department of Defense Military Munitions Response Program. Please see the map for the site location.

The Department of Defense is conducting a Non-Time Critical Removal Action of munitions debris and lead contaminated soil at two munitions response areas (MRA) identified as SR001 – Small Arms Range and Shooting-In Buttress, and SR002 – Firing-In Buttress. The primary military constituents (MC) of concern are lead contamination in soil, and in wooden timbers, posts and target backstops. Other MC to be removed includes copper shell casings and practice grenade debris. No munitions and explosives of concern (MEC) were identified during the field investigation. NYSDEC is overseeing this work under a Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA).

Highlights of the Upcoming Cleanup Activities

The goal of the cleanup action for the site is to achieve cleanup levels that protect public health and the environment. The cleanup action for the site includes:

The excavation and offsite disposal of lead contaminated soil and debris. Soil will be chemically stabilized to render it non-hazardous prior to disposal. Field work will begin in June 2014.

Background

The Hancock Field Air National Guard (ANG) base, home of the 174th Fighter Wing of the NY Air Guard, is located at 6001 East Malloy Road in the town of Dewitt, Onondaga County, NY. The Base currently occupies approximately 356 acres located immediately south of and adjacent to the Syracuse-Hancock International Airport. The base was originally built and activated in 1942 as a staging area for warplanes bound for England and was known as the Syracuse Army Air Base. Over subsequent decades, the base has housed several ANG fighter squadrons. Both the mission and the physical size of the base have been reduced from that initially established during World War II. Several large parcels of land located in the northern portion of the facility have been transferred to Onondaga County to expand the Syracuse-Hancock International Airport.

The surrounding land use, little changed in the past 30 years, is a mixture of transportation with the airport, recreational (golf course), industrial, commercial, and residential. Lands to the west, north, and east of the base have been used for military and transportation purposes for the past several decades. The base is bordered to the South by East Malloy Road. Across East Malloy Road is the Brooklawn golf course and several small commercial properties. The downtown City of Syracuse, New York, is located five miles southwest of the base.

Beginning about 1982, the Department of Defense (DOD), as part of the mandated military base realignment program, identified and investigated many potential areas of concern (AOC) on the ANG base. Several AOCs have been addressed over the years. Firing ranges SR001 and SR002 have been identified as requiring remediation.


