Remedy Proposed for State Superfund Site; Public Comment Period and Public Meeting Announced

**Public Meeting, Thursday, March 22, 2018 at 6:30 PM
Rochester City Hall, 30 Church Street, Room 208A**

NYSDEC invites you to a public meeting to discuss the remedy proposed for the site. You are encouraged to provide comments at the meeting, and during the 30-day comment period described in this fact sheet.

The public is invited to comment on a remedy proposed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) related to the Staubs Textile Services, Inc. site ("site") located at 935, 951 East Main Street, Rochester, Monroe County. Please see the map for the site location.

How to Comment

NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan for 30 days, from **March 1, 2018** through **March 30, 2018**. The proposed plan is available for review at the location(s) identified below under "Where to Find Information." Please submit comments to the NYSDEC project manager listed under Project Related Questions in the "Who to Contact" area below.

The site is listed as a Class "2" site in the State Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Sites (list of State Superfund sites). A Class 2 site represents a significant threat to public health or the environment; action is required.

Proposed Remedial Action Plan

The remedy is referred to as the No Further Action with Site Management remedy. The proposed remedy includes:

1. A remedial design program will be implemented to provide the details necessary for the operation, maintenance, and monitoring of the remedial program.
2. Long-term monitoring of on-site and off-site groundwater will be implemented to ensure conditions improve over time.
3. Evaluation of the potential for soil vapor intrusion for additional off-site buildings, including provisions for implementing actions to address exposures related to soil vapor intrusion, if any.
4. Imposition of an institutional control in the form of an environmental easement for the controlled property.
5. A Site Management Plan will be required.

NYSDEC developed the proposed remedy after reviewing the detailed investigation of the site and evaluating the remedial options in the "feasibility study" submitted under New York's State Superfund Program.

Next Steps

NYSDEC will consider public comments as it finalizes the remedy for the site. The selected remedy will be described in a document called a "Record of Decision" that will explain why the remedy was selected and respond to public comments. A detailed design of the selected remedy will then be prepared, and the cleanup will be performed. NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Background

Location: This Site is located at 951, 935 East Main Street in the City of Rochester, Monroe County. The 1.2-acre site is located in a mixed commercial/residential area on the northeast side of the city.

Site Features: The majority of the site is covered by the concrete slab of the former on-site building with a paved parking area on the west side and a small paved driveway on the east side of the property. The site is bound by East Main Street to the north, commercial properties to the west and east and a residential neighborhood to the south.

Current Zoning/Use(s): The site is currently inactive and is zoned for commercial use.

Historic Use(s): This site has a 70-year history of use as an industrial laundry and dry cleaning service. Operations at the facility ceased in 2005.

Operable Unit(s): The site was divided into two operable units. An operable unit represents a portion of a remedial program for a site that for technical or administrative reasons can be addressed separately to investigate, eliminate or mitigate a release, threat of release or exposure pathway resulting from the site contamination. Operable Unit (OU) No. 2, which is the subject of this document, consists of groundwater and off-site soil vapor intrusion.

A Record of Decision for OU1, which covers the on-site source area, was issued in December, 2016 and revised with an Explanation of Significant Difference in February, 2018.

A site location map is attached as Figure 1.

State Superfund Program: New York's State Superfund Program (SSF) identifies and characterizes suspected inactive hazardous waste disposal sites. Sites that pose a significant threat to public health and/or the environment go through a process of investigation, evaluation, cleanup and monitoring.

NYSDEC attempts to identify parties responsible for site contamination and require cleanup before committing State funds.


