

DIRECTIONS

FROM ALBANY

- * Take I-87 (Northway) north for 60 miles
- * Get off at Exit 23 (Warrensburg) and turn left onto Diamond Pt. Rd/County Road 35
- * Bear right on US 9 north for 4 miles
- * Turn left on NYS 28 and go about 58 miles. Note: Route 28 turns left in Blue Mountain Lake
- * Turn right on County Rte. 2 toward Raquette Lake and go ¼ mile to Raquette Lake Village
- * Curve right past the store, then left along the water, then right up the hill on Antlers Rd.
- * Go about ¾ mile and turn right to stay on Antlers Rd.
- * Pass Raquette Lake Girl's Camp and look for SUNY Cortland Antlers Facility on right
- * Turn in the driveway and park next to the large brown building on the left

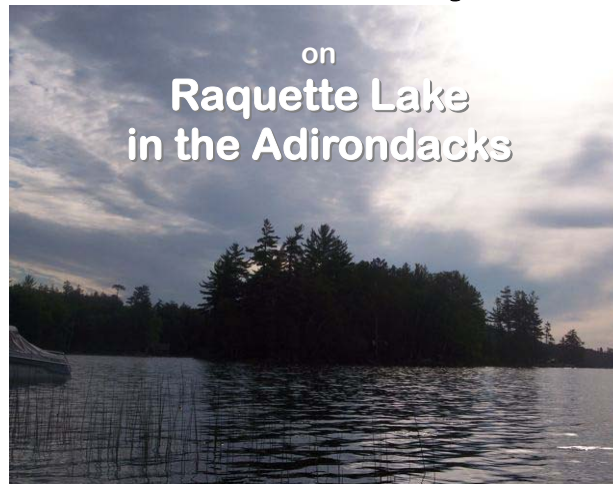
FROM UTICA

- * Take NYS Route 12 north for 24 miles
- * Bear right on NYS Route 28, go 48 miles
- * Turn left onto Hamilton County Route 2 toward Raquette Lake and go ¼ mile to Raquette Lake Village

- * Go about ¾ mile and turn right to stay on Antlers Rd.
