- (f) [With the exception of Lake Erie tributaries, w]Weight shall not be added to the line, leader, swivels, artificial fly or lure in any manner such that the weight hangs lower than the attached hook, artificial fly or lure when the line or leader is suspended vertically from the rod.
- (g) [With the exception of Lake Erie tributaries u]<u>U</u>se of more than one hook is prohibited, except that multiple hooks attached to floating lures are permitted as noted in "special provisions for floating lures" in clause (i) of this subparagraph.
- (h) [With the exception of Lake Erie tributaries, t] The use of hooks having more than one point is prohibited, except that double or treble hooks attached to floating lures are permitted as noted in "special provisions for floating lures" in clause (i) of this subparagraph. Artificial flies, as defined in 19.1(a)(3), are permitted with no more than two hook points on all Great Lakes tributaries.
- (i) Special provisions for floating lures:
 - (1) A *floating lure* is a lure that floats while at rest in water with or without any weight attached to the line, leader or lure.
 - (2) Multiple, single, double or treble hooks are permitted on floating lures.
 - (3) Any hooks on a floating lure, other than an artificial fly as defined in section 19.1 of this Title, must be attached thereto by a ring or swivel.
 - (4) The distance between the body of a floating lure and the points of any attached hooks shall not exceed one and one-half inches.

- (b) The taking of fish by bow is prohibited in all waters except as specifically permitted in this section. Fish permitted to be taken with a bow may be taken at any size and in any number.
- (c) Longbows may be used to take carp from May 15th through September 30th from any waters of the State where fishing, the harvest of carp, and the discharge of a bow is permitted.

Existing section 10.9 is repealed and existing section 10.10 is renumbered 10.9

§ 19.2 Use of fish for bait in the waters of the state of New York

Existing paragraph 19.2(b)(1) is amended to read as follows:

(1) Landlocked alewife (Alosa pseudoharengus), as defined in section [10.10]10.9 of this Title: Canandaigua Lake; Cannonsville Reservoir; Cayuga Lake; Cayuta Lake; Conesus Lake; Hemlock Lake; Canadice Lake; Waneta Lake; Keuka Lake; [Otsego Lake;] Otisco Lake; Owasco Lake; Lake Ontario; Lake Erie; Lamoka Lake; Pepacton Reservoir; Seneca Lake; St. Lawrence River; Niagara River; and all inland land-locked waters in Dutchess, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Sullivan, Ulster and Westchester Counties).

(e) Trout eggs produced in a hatchery under permit from the department, that are packaged for commercial purposes, and preserved by any method other than by freezing only, may be possessed, sold, offered for sale, bartered and transported overland and may be used as bait, except as prohibited by section 10.6 of this Chapter or any other provision of law or regulation. The trout eggs must be packaged in a container on which the name of the producer and the name of the hatchery under permit from the department where the trout eggs were produced are clearly indicated.

§ 35.3 Possession, sale and use of bait fish taken for commercial purposes.

Existing subdivision 35.3(d) is amended to read as follows:

(d) Bait fish taken for commercial purposes in the marine and coastal district, as defined in Environmental Conservation Law, section 13-0103, shall only be possessed or used in waters of the marine and coastal district and the Hudson River as defined in section $10.1(f)(7)(\underline{i}x)$ of this Title, and shall not be possessed or used in any water body outside the marine and coastal district, except the Hudson River as defined in section $10.1(f)(7)(\underline{i}x)$ of this Title.

§ 35.4 Sale of bait fish from waters outside the State of New York.

Existing paragraph 35.4(b)(1) is amended to read as follows:

(1) for use as bait in the marine and coastal district, as defined in Environmental Conservation Law, section 13-0103 and the Hudson River as defined in section $10.1(f)(7)(\underline{i}x)$ of this Title; or
