(CWM), to construct and operate a new landfill and other units for storage, treatment and disposal of hazardous and industrial non-hazardous waste at the company's facility located in the Towns of Porter and Lewiston. The proposed landfill, which CWM has designated as Residuals Management Unit – Two (RMU-2), would encompass about 43.5 acres and would have a capacity of approximately 4.0 million cubic yards for the disposal of hazardous and industrial non-hazardous waste. State laws and regulations require that CWM's proposed landfill project undergo a public/regulatory review process before any decisions are made to approve, disapprove or modify the project.
