Situated in a stand of white pine and northern hardwoods on the Sacandaga River, this serene campground offers prime fishing and hiking on nearby state lands. The campground offers a nature-based Junior Naturalist Program that encourages children to explore the surrounding environment.

AMENITIES: 143 campsites, picnic area with tables and fireplaces, hot showers/flush toilets, trailer dump station, boat launch on back side of Algonquin Lake, recycling center, pay telephone. Facilities provide access for the mobility impaired.

BOATING: No boat launch. Boat launch, boating and canoeing on nearby Algonquin Lake.

FISHING: Brook trout and smallmouth bass.

HIKING: A relatively easy 1.5 mile hike to Auger Falls. The 133-mile Northville-Lake Placid Trail is accessible nearby.

DAY-USE FACILITIES: Picnic area.

AREA ATTRACTIONS: Shopping, restaurants, movie theaters and golf courses nearby.

HISTORIC INTEREST: Camping at this area was well established before development as a campground was begun in 1920. Known locally as "The Forks," it was a popular and well-developed stop-over when limited traveling conditions required such camping areas. In 1923 it was considered the largest and best equipped of any of the campgrounds available at the time.

DAYS/HOURS OF OPERATION: Open mid-May through fall foliage season, closing on Columbus Day. Registration booth open daily from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.

DIRECTIONS from NYS Thruway (I-90): Exit 27 at Amsterdam; Rte. 30 north approx. 40 miles; campground located on left.
