


PROJECT LOCATION

Kashong Creek enters Seneca Lake in the Town of Geneva, Ontario County, New York, near the Ontario-Yates County line. The flood prone area lies between Route 14 and Seneca Lake near the mouth of Kashong Creek



PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project consists of 400 feet of improved channel. The existing dike on the left bank, looking downstream, is protected with riprap.

AUTHORIZATION

Construction of the improvement for flood control on Kashong Creek at the Town of Geneva, Ontario County, New York, was authorized by the Secretary of the Army with the approval of Congress in the Flood Control Act of 1946, Public Law No. 526, July 24th, 1946.

PROTECTION PROVIDED

The project was constructed to eliminate or reduce damage to 16 homes on the north side of the stream and a municipal water main which supplies about 800 homes.


CONSTRUCTION

Two previous projects are located at the site:

- In 1949 the Corps of Engineers completed a clearing and snagging project.
- In 1962 a make-shift dike was built and has been maintained by private residents of the area.

The emergency bank protection was completed on March 30th, 1973 and was turned over to the State of New York after a joint inspection during June of 1975.
