



# MALONE FLOOD DAMAGE REDUCTION PROJECT






## PROJECT LOCATION

The project is located on the Salmon River providing flood protection to the Village and Town of Malone, New York, in northern Franklin County.



## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The project extends from upstream of the Willow Street Bridge to the Cady Road Bridge, and consisted of clearing and snagging along the bed and banks of the Salmon River for the passage of ice flows and to reduce the threat of ice and debris jams. Isolated shoals were removed, and deeper channels were provided at some locations to concentrate flows and retard production of ice in the channel. Work was completed October 30, 1959.

## **AUTHORIZATION**

Clearing and snagging for flood control in the Salmon River, Malone, New York, was authorized by Office of Chief of Engineers, in September 1957, under Public Law No. 780 – 83<sup>rd</sup> Congress, Second Session, called the “1954 Flood Control Act.”


## **PROTECTION PROVIDED**

The project was designed to reduce the threat of flooding in the Town and Village of Malone resulting from ice and debris jams in the Salmon River.


## **CONSTRUCTION**

Clearing and snagging of the project area began November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1958, with rented tractor and dragline equipment under the supervision and direction of Corps of Engineers personnel. Work was completed October 30<sup>th</sup>, 1959, at a cost of approximately \$45,000.
