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SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: All right, ladies
and gentlemen, if everyone would find seats, we
will begin. Let me just apologize in advance for
the sound of my voice and my demeanor this morning.
I've had a head cold for about a week, one day it's
on, one day it's off and today it's on, so I don't
normally sound this nasal.
Having said that, Mr. Labriola, would
you poll the Board?
MR. LABRIOLA: Supervisor Venditto?
SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: Here.
MR. LABRIOLA: Councilman Muscarella?
COUNCILMAN MUSCARELLA: Here.
MR. LABRIOLA: Councilman Macagnone?
COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Present.

MR. LABRIOLA: Councilman Coschignano?

COUNCILMAN COSCHIGNANO: Here.

MR. LABRIOLA: Councilwoman Walker?

COUNCILWOMAN WALKER: Here.

MR. LABRIOLA: Councilwoman Faughnan?

COUNCILWOMAN WALKER: She's on her way.

MR. LABRIOLA: Councilman Pinto?

COUNCILMAN PINTO: Here.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: All right. If everyone would please rise and join in the pledge

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of allegiance to our flag led by Councilwoman Rose Walker.

(Pledge of Allegiance.)

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: My selection of Councilwoman Walker to lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance was symbolic and we'll talk about that a little bit later.

In the meantime, Mr. Labriola, if you would call the first hearing.

MR. LABRIOLA: To consider the application from the Bethpage Water District for the issuance of serial bonds in the amount of \$15,500,000 apportioned between the Town of Oyster Bay and the Town of Hempstead to pay the cost of increases and improvements to the Water District.

MR. SABINO: Good morning. Only 15 million.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: Oh, that's it? You're still a cheap date.

MR. SABINO: Good morning, Mr.

Supervisor, members of the Board, I wish you all a happy and healthy holiday season.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: You didn't hear

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what I said. I said you're still a cheap date.

MR. SABINO: And I have the same head cold, so I don't know who you've been dating, but obviously we're dating the same person.

As the Town Clerk said, I'm here to request a bond financing in the amount of \$15.5 million apportioned between the Town of Oyster Bay and the Town of Hempstead. Approximately 92 percent of the District is located in the Town of Oyster Bay and 8 percent located in the Town of Hempstead. Therefore, the Oyster Bay portion is 13.95 million. The money we are requesting is to fund six water remediation projects. As most of you know, Bethpage is most closely and heavily impacted by the Grumman contamination that is on that site that this Town Board knows a little bit about. We've been dealing with the problem since Grumman to date has paid the Water District 1990. 8.5 million to construct water treatment facilities at several of our plants. Presently, roughly fifteen, twenty years later, after we started the construction of the initial facilities, the contamination has continued to migrate from the Grumman site southward toward the bulk of our well field. Approximately 50 percent of the District's

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supply is located directly in line with the Grumman plume. Our engineers have advised us through an engineering report that we need to take action now to continue and improve the remediation facilities presently located in the southern portion of our District. You should have in front of you an engineering report dated 2009 from Holzmacher, McLendon & Murrell, the H2M Group, which outlines in detail the cost of the facilities, the contamination that threatens us and why we are here today.

As recently as November 16th, the

District had a meeting with Grumman representatives
who informed us that the contamination that we are
facing is both more concentrated, deeper and a
greater threat than we had originally thought.

That has made this application somewhat of an
emergency. The last time I was here before this
Board was in 1994 and we requested \$5 million worth
of bond financing. We were very fortunate that one
of the responsible parties, namely, the United
States Navy, gave us a cash pay-out and we only
used 2 million of that \$5 million financing
authorized and Grumman is currently paying 100
percent of the \$2 million bond financing. So that

bond issue cost our taxpayers zero. This bond issue I expect a similar result, although I do not believe it will be 100 percent. Presently, in the event we have to use all 15.5 million with no contribution from outside sources, namely, the PRPs, the potentially responsible parties, it will cost a District taxpayer \$65 per year per household in our District.

Unfortunately, while any tax increase in today's climate is difficult, there is no way pure water can continue to be supplied by the Bethpage Water District without the construction of these facilities.

Now, out of that \$65, we do expect
Grumman to be responsible for at least \$8 million
of that, so that would cut that \$65 in half. With
any luck, we'll get them to pay more, but I will
add that the negotiations that are ongoing with
Grumman presently have not gone quite as well as
they did in 1994 when Grumman was located in
Bethpage. Now I deal with a California corporate
bureaucracy which doesn't feel the same need to
provide funding as they did in 1994.

I have with me today our engineer who could talk to you about any of the technical

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details or questions that you may have and the District Superintendent to talk about operations if you need to hear anything about that that I can't answer.

So members of the Board, that is the presentation, we request bond financing to the tune of \$15.5 million, \$13.95 million which will be issued by the Town of Oyster Bay. I'd be happy to answer any questions that you have.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: No, except that when good things happen, the Town of Hempstead always seems to have the lion's share of it, but when the burden happens, we get walloped.

MR. SABINO: Yes.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: It is what it is.

Other than check off with my own people, I don't see Bob McEvoy in the room, I don't really think it's necessary. The Bethpage Water District has great credibility with this Town Board and you have the best water in the world and --

MR. SABINO: That is correct. I'm glad you noticed.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: And I voted.

There were three supervisors who voted on that, by
the way, and I lobbied to get one of them, I won't

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say who it was, but it was me, Bellone and Petrone, so I won't say which one I cajcled, but seriously in the Town of Oyster Bay, they do a great job, you have great credibility with us. I really think that's all I need to know.

The only thing I did want to touch base with, Len, did you say Rob Darienzo was here?

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR GENOVA: Yes

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: Rob, just touching base with you and anyone from the Town Attorney's office.

 $$\operatorname{MR.}$$ DARIENZO: We are prepared to issue the debt. Absolutely.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: Freddie Mei?

MR. MEI: It is good.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: Okay. We're good to go? Okay. Unless the Board members have any questions, Anthony, I think we're fine.

MR. SABINO: Thank you, Mr. Supervisor, members of the Board.

SUPERVISOR VENDITTO: All right.

Thank you.

Mr. Labriola, do we have any correspondence?
