Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Classification Notice

The Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Program (the State Superfund Program) is the State's program for identifying, investigating, and cleaning up sites where the disposal of hazardous waste may present a threat to public health and/or the environment. The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) maintains a list of these sites in the Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Sites (Registry). As of the date of this notice, the site identified above, and located on a map on the reverse side of this page, was reclassified on the Registry as a Class 4 site as it no longer presents a significant threat to public health and/or the environment for the following reason(s):

Landfill waste material and groundwater were contaminated with volatile organic compounds and metals. Remedial activities included: removal of 29 drums and 150 tons of leaded paint sludge; modified Part 360 landfill consolidation, closure and capping; passive gas venting: elimination of an up-gradient pond which had contributed to landfill leachate generation; design of a new drainage system around the landfill; and, long-term monitoring. Human exposures to contamination remaining at the site are being addressed with institutional and engineering controls (documented in the February 2014 environmental notice) as follows:

- **Soil:** Use and development of the site is restricted to commercial and industrial uses and must not breach the landfill cap, cover or other components of the containment system. An *Operations and Maintenance Manual* is in place detailing the description of all procedures required to manage remaining contamination at the site.
- **Groundwater:** An up-gradient pond which had contributed to landfill leachate generation and migration has been eliminated and a storm water/surface water management and drainage conveyance system installed. Groundwater use is restricted by the environmental notice. In addition, multiple sampling of residential wells has not indicated any landfill related contamination.
- **Soil Vapor:** Soil vapor intrusion concerns are not expected as there are restrictions on landfill use and currently in-place gas venting systems. There are no concerns for off-site soil vapor migration.

Periodic reviews will continue to be completed to certify that these controls are maintained and remain effective.

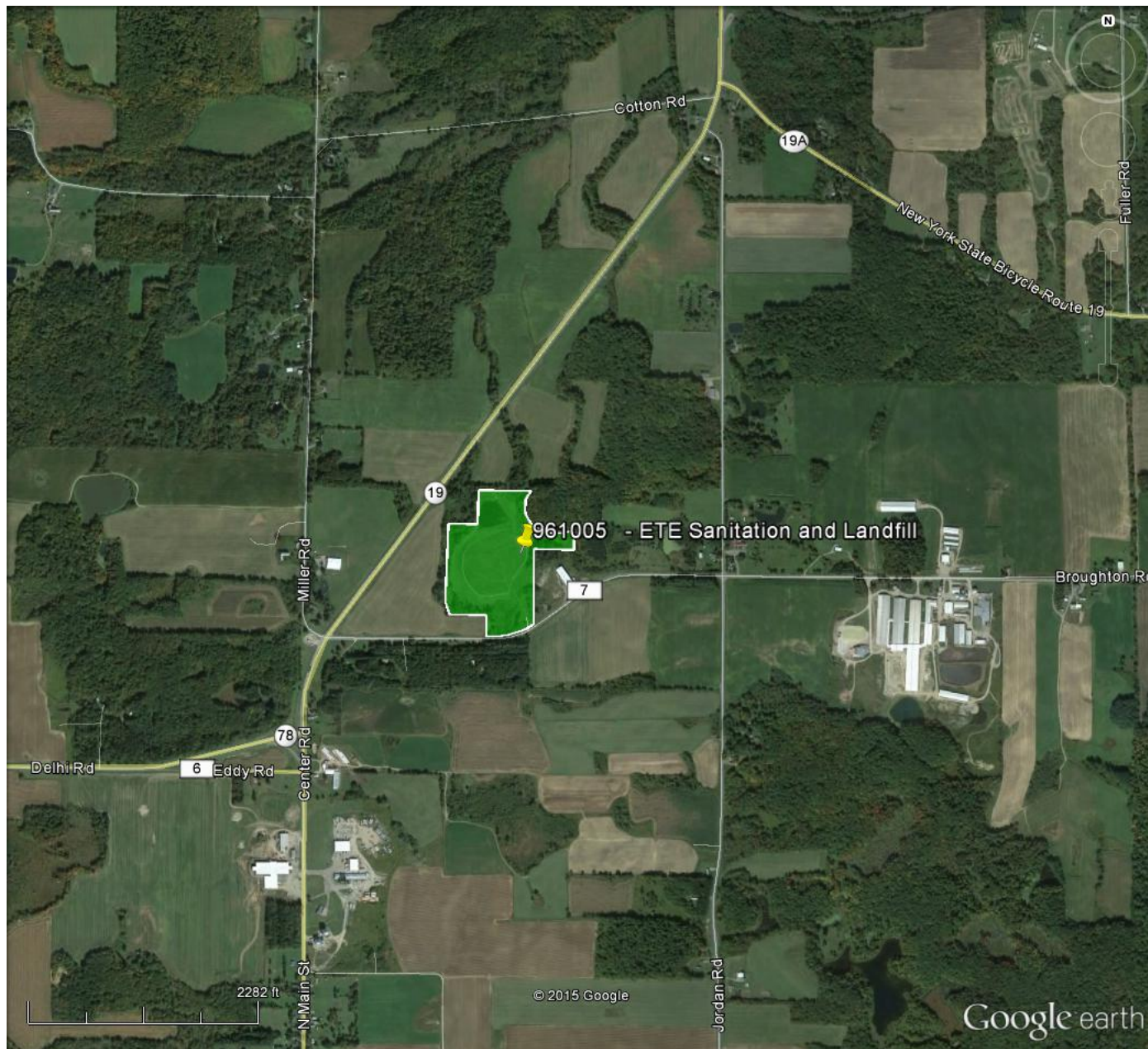
