Interim Remedial Measure Proposed; Public Comment Period Announced

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), is proposing an expedited cleanup of contamination at the President Street Properties site ("site") located at Bond, Carroll and President Streets, Brooklyn, NY. Please see the map for the site location. The expedited cleanup activities are expected to begin in April 2020 and last about three months. The activities will be performed by Rabsky Group ("applicant") with oversight provided by NYSDEC.

How to Comment: NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan for 30 days, from **February 19** through **March 20, 2020**.

Draft Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) Work Plan: An IRM is a cleanup activity that may be performed when a source of contamination or exposure pathway (the way in which a person may contact contamination) can be effectively addressed without extensive investigation and evaluation.

The draft IRM work plan describes proposed cleanup activities that include:

- Installation of a steel sheet pile cutoff wall and bulkhead to serve as a subsurface containment/cut-off wall to eliminate contaminant migration;
- Excavation and off-site disposal of excess soil/fill generated during construction of the bulkhead and sheet pile cutoff wall;
- Collection and analysis of soil samples as required for off-site disposal;
- Surveying excavations and components of the bulkhead and sheet pile cutoff wall by a New York State Professional Land Surveyor;
- Dewatering and treatment or proper disposal of groundwater exhibiting petroleum impacts or exceeding the NYCDEP Sanitary or Combined Sewer Effluent Discharge Parameters during implementation of the IRM:

- Collecting and analysis of end-point soil samples;
- Importing clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as backfill;
- Implementing a Construction Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities.

Site Description: The President Street Properties site is 2.123 acres and is located in the Gowanus neighborhood of Brooklyn, NY. The site is identified as Block 445, Lot 8 (327 Bond Street), and Block 438, Lots 1 (325 Bond Street), 2 (323 Bond Street) and 3 (319 Bond Street) and includes the former President Street. The site is bound by a parking lot and commercial development to the north; the Gowanus Canal to the east; a two-story residential development and commercial/industrial property fronting on Carroll Street to the south; and Bond Street to the west. The current use of the site is for commercial and industrial use. The intended use of the site will be for commercial use.

Summary of the Investigation: The primary contaminants of concern at the site are petroleum hydrocarbons, volatile organic compounds (VOCs) semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOCs), and metals which are present sitewide in soil. Groundwater will be sampled as part of a sitewide Remedial Investigation (RI).

Next Steps: NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the plan as necessary, and approve the IRM work plan in consultation with the New York State Department of Health. The approved work plan will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information" on the front page).

When the expedited cleanup activities are completed, a Construction Completion Report will be prepared that documents the activities that were performed. The future RI report will illustrate the results of the site-wide investigation.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
