### Remedy Proposed for Brownfield Site Contamination; Public Comment Period Announced

The public is invited to comment on a proposed remedy being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), to address contamination related to the 975 Nostrand Avenue site ("site") located in Brooklyn, NY. Please see the map for the site location.

Based on the findings of the investigation, NYSDEC in consultation with the NYSDOH has determined that the site poses a significant threat to public health or the environment. This decision is based on the potential for off-site migration of contaminants in the soil vapor. To address this threat, NYSDEC has developed the proposed remedy summarized below.

**How to Comment:** NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan, called a "Draft Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP)" for 45 days, from **June 30 through August 14, 2022**.

**Draft Remedial Work Plan:** The proposed Conditional Unrestricted Use remedy consists of:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of contaminated soil to 15 feet below surface grade across the entire site;
- Screening for indications of contamination of all excavated soil during any intrusive site work;
- Sampling and off-site disposal of all materials removed from the site in accordance with all federal, state, and local rules and regulations for handling, transport, and disposal;
- Removing Underground Storage Tanks (USTs), if any are encountered;
- Collecting and analyzing post excavation confirmation soil samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy;
- Importing clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as backfill;
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities;

- Installation and operation of an active sub-slab depressurization system to mitigate the potential for soil vapor intrusion into the new building to be constructed at the site.
- Installation of a contingent soil vapor extraction system to prevent off-site migration of contaminated soil vapor.
- Developing a Site Management Plan (SMP) for maintenance of the remedial systems.
- Recording of an Environmental Easement to ensure proper use of the site.

If the implemented remedy does not achieve the remedial action objectives within 5 years and engineering controls continue to be required, the conditional Track 1 remedy will revert to a track 2 remedy requiring long term monitoring and maintenance of the engineering controls.

The proposed remedy was developed by Nostrand Green LLC ("applicant") after performing a detailed investigation of the site under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). A "Remedial Investigation Report," which describes the results of the site investigation was submitted concurrently with the Remedial Action Work Plan and is also available for review at the locations identified on Page 1.

**Next Steps:** NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the cleanup plan as necessary, and issue a final Decision Document. NYSDOH must concur with the proposed remedy. After approval, the proposed remedy becomes the selected remedy. The applicant(s) may then design and perform the cleanup action to address the site contamination, with oversight by NYSDEC and NYSDOH.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

**Site Description:** The site consists of an irregularly shaped 1.369-acre parcel that was most recently developed with a vacant one-story commercial use building (formerly used as a supermarket) built between 1965 and 1970 on a portion of the site with the remainder comprising an asphalt-paved surface parking lot. Prior to the construction of the current building, the site was occupied by various uses including stores, a

parking garage, a printing facility, upholstery facility, and a carpenter, an auto repair shop, a printing press, hand laundry facility, an exterminator, and an auto school.

The site will be redeveloped with a new mixed-use residential and commercial use building. Additional site details, including environmental and health assessment summaries, are available on NYSDEC's Environmental Site Remediation Database (by entering the site ID, C224335) at:

**Summary of the Investigation:** Contaminants of concern include VOCs, PAHs, pesticides, and metals in soil/fill, chlorinated solvent-related VOCs and metals in groundwater, and chlorinated solvent-related and petroleum-related VOCs in soil vapor.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
