NYSDEC Certifies Cleanup Requirements Achieved at Brownfield Site

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) has determined that the cleanup requirements to address contamination related to the Crannell Square site ("site") located at 35 Catharine street in Poughkeepsie, Dutchess County, under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program have been or will be met. Please see the map for the site location.

The cleanup activities were performed by The Kearney Realty & Development Group Inc., Crannell Square Housing Development Fund Company, Inc., and Crannell Square Limited Partnership ("applicants") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). NYSDEC has approved a Final Engineering Report (FER) and issued a Certificate of Completion (COC) for the site.

Completion of the Project: The following activities have been completed to achieve the remedial action objectives:

- Excavation Excavation and off-site disposal of approximately 12,500 cubic yards of contaminated soil and historic fill material exceeding the unrestricted use soil cleanup objectives. One 550-gallon underground storage tank was also removed from the excavation.
- Clean backfill was imported to the site and used to establish grades, as needed.
- The site has achieved site cleanup goals suitable for unrestricted use.
 As such, not site management plan or environmental easement are needed.

BROWNFIELD CLEANUP PROGRAM

Final Engineering Report Approved: NYSDEC has approved the FER, which:

- 1) Describes the cleanup activities completed.
- 2) Certifies that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved for the site.

Next Steps: With its receipt of a COC, the applicants are eligible to redevelop the site. In addition, the applicants are eligible for tax credits to offset the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site. A COC may be modified or revoked if, for example, there is a failure to comply with the terms of the order or agreement with NYSDEC.

Site Description: The site is an approximately square 1.11-acre partial parcel in downtown Poughkeepsie. The site is bordered on the north by the East-West Arterial, on the west by Catharine Street, and on the south by Crannell Street. The site was used for commercial and residential purposes from as early as 1887 until circa 1960, when all former on-site structures were demolished. Previous historical structures included: an automotive repair facility, a large private garage, a warehouse, a school (eventually used as boarding house/hotel) and multiple dwellings. The site was developed by the City of Poughkeepsie as a municipal parking lot circa 1963. The site is currently being redeveloped as a multi-use apartment complex and the new structure has been erected.

Prior to remediation, the primary contaminants of concern included metals and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) in soil. Remedial actions have successfully achieved soil cleanup objectives for unrestricted use.
