Remedy Proposed for Brownfield Site Contamination; Public Comment Period Announced

The public is invited to comment on a proposed remedy being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), to address contamination related to the Block 417 New Rochelle site ("site") located at 327-329 Huguenot Street, New Rochelle, Westchester County. Please see the map for the site location.

Based on the findings of the investigation, NYSDEC in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) has determined that the site does not pose a significant threat to public health or the environment. This decision is based on the removal of all soils on-site; the lack of contamination in groundwater on-site; and the results of the off-site exposure assessment that showed low potential for human exposure to site-related contaminants via soil vapor intrusion.

How to Comment: NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan, called a "Draft Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP)" for 45 days, from **April 6 through May 21, 2022**.

Draft Remedial Work Plan: The proposed Unrestricted Use remedy consists of:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of contaminated soil to bedrock across the entire site;
- Removing Underground Storage Tanks (USTs);
- Importing clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as backfill;
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities;
- If an Unrestricted Use cleanup is not achieved, implementation of a Site Management Plan (SMP) would also be required for long-term maintenance of the remedial systems.
- If an Unrestricted Use cleanup is not achieved, recording of an Environmental Easement to ensure proper use of the site may be necessary.

BROWNFIELD CLEANUP PROGRAM

The proposed remedy was developed by RFMCH Huguenot Property Owner II LLC and RFMCH Huguenot Development Partners II LLC ("applicants") after performing a detailed investigation of the site under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP).

Next Steps: NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the cleanup plan as necessary, and issue a final Decision Document. NYSDOH must concur with the proposed remedy. After approval, the proposed remedy becomes the selected remedy. The applicant(s) may then design and perform the cleanup action to address the site contamination, with oversight by NYSDEC and NYSDOH.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Site Description: The 0.344-acre site is bordered on the south by Centre Avenue and on the east by Huguenot Street. The site is currently under construction. The site was used for residential purposes (apartment building) in the early 1900s until 1990 when the City of New Rochelle acquired the site, demolished the building, and converted the site into a parking lot. The anticipated redevelopment includes a mixed-use residential/commercial apartment building.

Summary of the Investigation: The primary contaminants of concern at the site are semi-volatile organic compounds

(SVOCs), metals, and pesticides which are present sitewide in soil. The SVOCs and metals are likely related to historic fill. Pesticides are likely from historic use on the property. Groundwater within the bedrock beneath the site is not impacted.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


