FACT SHEET VOLUNTARY CLEANUP INVESTIGATION TO BEGIN AT 45 KEAN STREET SITE

INTRODUCTION

In July 2000, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) will begin a detailed environmental study at the 45 Kean Street Voluntary Cleanup Site. The site is located in an industrial area at 45 Kean Street in the Town of Babylon, Suffolk County. The 0.87-acre site has been owned by Mr. Max Gysin since the mid-1970's and contains a 20,000 square-foot industrial building that is currently unoccupied. See map on reverse showing the location of the site. The Diamond Roller Corporation, a manufacturer of printing press rollers, occupied the site from the early 1970's to July 1996. From October 1996 to September 1997, Matrix Metalworks, Inc. occupied the site. Previous investigations revealed high levels of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in an on-site drywell. The drywell was remediated to the water table by the owner; however, high levels of VOCs remain in the saturated soils. In June 2000, Mr. Gysin (the "Volunteer") entered into a Voluntary Cleanup Agreement with the NYSDEC to investigate and, if necessary, remediate the site.

SITE INVESTIGATION


The study to be done at the 45 Kean Street site is called a "Voluntary Cleanup Investigation". The investigation will determine the nature and extent of the contamination at the site, as well as potential threats to public health and the environment. As part of the investigation, soil and groundwater will be sampled at various locations and depths. Field work for the investigation will begin on or about July 24, 2000 and should be completed within two months. Copies of the workplan which describes the investigation in detail are available for your review at the document repositories listed below. Based on the results of the investigation (which may be available in mid-2001), the Volunteer will propose a means for cleaning up the site. Following consideration of public comments on the proposed cleanup plan, NYSDEC will select the remedy and implement it.


