State Superfund Site Delist Notice

The Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Program (the State Superfund Program) is the State's program for identifying, investigating, and cleaning up sites where the disposal of hazardous waste may present a threat to public health and/or the environment. The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) maintains a list of these sites in the Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Sites (Registry). DEC has determined that this site ([see map on reverse side](#)) no longer presents a threat to public health or the environment and is proposing to delist the site from the Registry for the following reason(s):

- A comprehensive site investigation was conducted which included sampling for metals, volatile organic compounds, semi-volatile organic compounds, PCBs, and pesticides. The findings showed that the mercury detected on-site was in the form of inorganic mercury salt (i.e., not elemental mercury); and the detected concentrations only slightly exceeded the cleanup objectives at two sampling locations. To address this, an institutional control in the form of a deed restriction has been recorded for the main facility and parking lot, restricting site use and development to commercial or industrial uses. These measures have been deemed sufficient to address potential exposures to remaining contamination.

Public comments are being received before the decision to remove the site from the Registry is finalized. The public comment period will end November 6, 2020. If we do not receive any new or additional information during this public comment period that changes our delist proposal, we will delist the site on or after December 6, 2020.
