Existing paragraph 10.1(f)(1) is amended to read as follows:

(2) Bait fish taken for personal use in the marine and coastal district, as defined in Environmental Conservation Law, section 13-0103, shall only be possessed or used in waters of the marine and coastal district and the Hudson River as defined in subparagraph (7)(ix) of this subdivision, and shall not be possessed or used in a water body outside the marine and coastal district, except the Hudson River as defined in subparagraph (7)(ix) of this subdivision.

Existing clause 10.1(f)(3)(iii)(c) is amended to read as follows:

(c) Hudson River overland transportation corridor shall mean the geographical area associated with the water body as defined in subparagraph (7)(ix) of this subdivision starting at the eastern shore of the Hudson River at the Federal Dam in Troy, continuing east on W. Glenn Avenue in Troy to its intersection with State Route 4, then continuing south on State Route 4 to its intersection with State Routes 9 and 20, then continuing easterly to its intersection with State Route 9, then continuing east on State Route 82, then continuing east on State Route 82 to its intersection with the Taconic State Parkway, then continuing south on the Taconic State Parkway to its intersection with the Sprain Brook Parkway, then continuing south on the Sprain Brook Parkway to its intersection with I-287, then continuing west on I-287 across the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge to I-87 North, then continuing north on I-87 to where State Route 9W crosses I-87 in Greene County, then continuing north on State Route 9W to where State Route 9W crosses I-87 in Albany County, then continuing north on I-87 to its intersection with State Route 7, and then continuing east on State Route 7 to its intersection with I-787, and then continuing north on I-787 to its intersection with Tibbets Avenue, and then continuing east on

Tibbets Avenue to its intersection with Delaware Avenue, then proceeding in a straight line to the west edge of the Troy Dam.

Existing sub-paragraph 10.1(f)(7)(iii) and 10.1(f)(7)(iv) are deleted and sub-paragraphs 10.1(f)(7)(v) through 10.1(f)(7)(xii) are renumbered 10.1(f)(7)(iv) through 10.1(f)(7)(xi). New sub-paragraph 10.1(f)(7)(iii) is added to read as follows:

New paragraph 10.2(b)(6) is added to read as follows:

(6) fish from March 16 through April 30 on the following waters:

- (i) Oswegatchie River from north side of the lower most bridge, St. Rte. 68, upstream to the dam in Ogdensburg
- (ii) Little Sandy Creek in Oswego County from the State Route 3 bridge downstream 850 feet to the intersection of the channelized area and upstream 1.0 mile from the bridge to the Public Fishing Rights section
- (iii) Grasse River from the downstream side of the ALCOA Road bridge upstream to the upstream side of the Main Street bridge in the Village of Massena in St. Lawrence County

Existing subparagraph 10.2(c)(1)(ii) is amended to read as follows:

- (ii) From September 1st through March 31st of the following year, the following regulations shall apply to Lake Ontario tributaries:
  - (a) Fishing from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise is prohibited, except in the Black River (Jefferson County) from Lake Ontario upstream to Route 180 bridge in Dexter.
  - (b) Hooks attached to any lure, except an artificial fly as defined in section 19.1 of this Title or jigs, shall be free-swinging.

(c) Hooks shall not have a gap (distance between the shank and the point) greater than one-half inch.

(d) Use of hooks with added weight is prohibited, except that artificial flies and jigs weighing no more than one-eighth ounce are permitted.

(e) The distance between the hook, artificial fly or lure and any weight attached to the line or leader, whether fixed or sliding, shall not exceed four feet.

(f) [With the exception of Lake Erie tributaries, w]Weight shall not be added to the line, leader, swivels, artificial fly or lure in any manner such that the weight hangs lower than the attached hook, artificial fly or lure when the line or leader is suspended vertically from the rod.

(g) [With the exception of Lake Erie tributaries u]Use of more than one hook is prohibited, except that multiple hooks attached to floating lures are permitted as noted in "special provisions for floating lures" in clause (i) of this subparagraph.

(h) [With the exception of Lake Erie tributaries, t]The use of hooks having more than one point is prohibited, except that double or treble hooks attached to floating lures are permitted as noted in "special provisions for floating lures" in clause (i) of this subparagraph. Artificial flies, as defined in 19.1(a)(3), are permitted with no more than two hook points on all Great Lakes tributaries.

(i) Special provisions for floating lures:

(1) A *floating lure* is a lure that floats while at rest in water with or without any weight attached to the line, leader or lure.

(2) Multiple, single, double or treble hooks are permitted on floating lures.

(3) Any hooks on a floating lure, other than an artificial fly as defined in section 19.1 of this Title, must be attached thereto by a ring or swivel.

(4) The distance between the body of a floating lure and the points of any attached hooks shall not exceed one and one-half inches.

Existing subparagraphs 10.2(c)(1)(iii) through 10.2(c)(1)(iv) are renumbered 10.2(c)(1)(iv) through 10.2(c)(1)(v). New subparagraph 10.2(c)(1)(iii) is added to read as follows:

(iii) From September 1st through March 31st of the following year, the following regulations shall apply to Lake Erie tributaries:

(a) Fishing from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise is prohibited.

(b) Hooks attached to any lure, except an artificial fly as defined in section 19.1 of this Title or jigs, shall be free-swinging.

(c) Hooks shall not have a gap (distance between the shank and the point) greater than one-half inch.

Existing clause 10.2(g)(2)(j) is deleted.

Existing subparagraph 10.2(h)(1)(ii) is amended to read as follows:

(ii) the Ausable River beginning at the marked boundary 800 feet west of the first State Route 9 bridge upstream from Lake Champlain, continuing upstream and ending at Rainbow Falls.

**§ 10.3 Additional special fishing regulations for certain inland waters.**

Existing Subdivision 10.3(a) is amended to read as follows:

(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 10.1 of this Part and in accordance with Table A in subdivision (b) and Table B in subdivision (c) of this section, no person, when fishing on the designated waters listed in [Table A]Tables A or B, shall fish in a manner contrary to that specified nor take or possess on the specially designated waters or shores thereof fish of the species listed for those waters:

(1) other than during the [open season] time period (open season) specified for such species in the regulation;

(2) of a size less than that specified for such species; and

(3) in excess of the daily limit specified for such species.

(1) Landlocked alewife (*Alosa pseudoharengus*), as defined in section [10.10]10.9 of this Title: Canandaigua Lake; Cannonsville Reservoir; Cayuga Lake; Cayuta Lake; Conesus Lake; Hemlock Lake; Canadice Lake; Waneta Lake; Keuka Lake; [Otsego Lake;] Otisco Lake; Owasco Lake; Lake Ontario; Lake Erie; Lamoka Lake; Pepacton Reservoir; Seneca Lake; St. Lawrence River; Niagara River; and all inland land-locked waters in Dutchess, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Sullivan, Ulster and Westchester Counties).

New subdivision 19.2(e) is added to read as follows:

(e) Trout eggs produced in a hatchery under permit from the department, that are packaged for commercial purposes, and preserved by any method other than by freezing only, may be possessed, sold, offered for sale, bartered and transported overland and may be used as bait, except as prohibited by section 10.6 of this Chapter or any other provision of law or regulation. The trout eggs must be packaged in a container on which the name of the producer and the name of the hatchery under permit from the department where the trout eggs were produced are clearly indicated.

### **§ 35.3 Possession, sale and use of bait fish taken for commercial purposes.**



Existing subdivision 35.3(d) is amended to read as follows:

(d) Bait fish taken for commercial purposes in the marine and coastal district, as defined in Environmental Conservation Law, section 13-0103, shall only be possessed or used in waters of the marine and coastal district and the Hudson River as defined in section 10.1(f)(7)(ix) of this Title, and shall not be possessed or used in any water body outside the marine and coastal district, except the Hudson River as defined in section 10.1(f)(7)(ix) of this Title.

**§ 35.4 Sale of bait fish from waters outside the State of New York.**

Existing paragraph 35.4(b)(1) is amended to read as follows:

(1) for use as bait in the marine and coastal district, as defined in Environmental Conservation Law, section 13-0103 and the Hudson River as defined in section 10.1(f)(7)(ix) of this Title; or
