Replanting the Streams of New York State

In partnership with local volunteers, the Trees for Tribs Program plants trees and shrubs along the tributary streams of New York State to:

- Reduce water pollution
- Reduce erosion and flood damage
- Provide habitat for fish and other wildlife



How Does the Program Work?

Trees for Tribs works with regional partners to offer free native trees and shrubs for qualifying streamside planting projects. Program staff may be able to assist with plant selection, designing a planting plan, and other technical assistance to improve the odds of success for your project.

Applicants must complete an application, recruit volunteers for planting, and maintain the site after planting is complete.

Both public and private sites may qualify, but preference will be given to:

- Projects of local watershed groups, land trusts, and other environmental organizations
- Project sites located in high-profile, public or highly visible areas, such as town parks
