The purpose of the issues conference is to determine party status for those who have properly filed petitions, and to define the scope of issues, if any, that require adjudication with regard to the permit applications pending before the Department, and the certificate requested from the Facility Siting Board. Please note that participation at the issues conference is limited to Department staff, applicant, and those persons who previously filed petitions for party status consistent with the requirements outlined in the October 15, 2014 notice referenced above.
