New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and Department of Health (DOH) are overseeing a thorough cleanup of contamination found below-ground on portions of the Elmira High School property and remains committed to ensuring the students, faculty, and community are kept informed of these actions. DEC will be holding a meeting on **Tuesday, July 26, 2022 at 5 PM** in the cafeteria of the Elmira High School (EHS). There will not be a formal presentation. Instead, project experts involved in the cleanups will be available to respond directly to questions and comments from the attending public. Representatives from DEC, DOH, Unisys Corporation, and EHS will be available to provide detailed information on the extensive work completed this past year, the ongoing work on the athletic field, and plans for future investigation and cleanup activities. We look forward to addressing your questions and concerns.
