## Announcing the 'Create A Watershed Super Hero" Poster Contest

Sponsored by NYS Department of Environmental Conservation & New York Water Environment Association

#### **Contest Theme**

What you do at home and in your community affects everyone downstream. This poster contest is meant to encourage students to learn about their role in the watershed they live in and how to conserve and protect our water resources, now and for future generations.

# Show how "Creating a Watershed Super Hero can be an inspiration for positive environmental action"!

Posters must clearly convey this message.

### **Poster Requirements**

Posters must contain original hand-drawn artwork - no computergenerated posters or graphics. Copyrighted characters (such as Superman, Batman, etc.) and clip art **will not be accepted**.

**Material:** You may use any type of media,

including watercolor, pen and ink,

crayon, chalk and markers.

Size: 8 ½" x 11", landscape layout

**Background:** White only, no colored paper backgrounds

Posters will be on public display and should be easy to see or read. Winning posters will be compiled for distribution as part of a 2023 calendar.

#### **Prizes and Awards**

Each participant receives a Certificate of Recognition.

The top 14 posters will be included in a 2023 calendar which will be distributed throughout New York State.

The 14 winning students receive their framed poster and an invitation to a local NYWEA chapter event.

## Who's Eligible?

All Middle School students in New York State public and private schools are eligible to enter the poster contest. **One student per poster.** 

### **Judging Procedure**

DEC and NYWEA members will review all posters and pick the top 30 entries. NYWEA membership and DEC staff will vote for the 14 winning posters.

## **Judging Criteria**

- Clear and correct message conveyed by text and artwork
- Creativity, originality, and artistic quality
- Visual clarity

- Entries must meet poster requirements
- Fasten the attached release form to the back of the poster.
- All submitted artwork becomes the property of NYSDEC and NYWEA and will be reproduced.

#### **Lesson Plan Ideas**

A lesson plan for "We all live in a Watershed", a PowerPoint for teachers and a worksheet for students was developed (posted on https://www.dec.ny.gov/education/32108.html ). The lesson includes locating a watershed and identification of possible pollution sources in the watershed. The lesson is designed for students to brainstorm solutions to reduce and prevent pollution within the watershed.

### **Hot Topic**

What activities can humans undertake to improve the environment? Specifically, there are lots of actions that people can take to protect water proper fertilizer application, septic tank maintenance, planting vegetation along the shoreline (buffer), clean up pet waste, plant rain gardens, pump-out boats properly, and help prevent sewage spills (don't dump fats or grease; don't flush diapers, baby wipes or personal hygiene products). We are all stewards of the environment! What would your Super Hero do to make your watershed better?
