 - Availability of donated deer is an issue

- Goal: Half of all Deer Damage Permit takes go to Venison Donation Coalition
 - o Looking for a good faith effort
 - o This could be a great article for the *Conservationist* magazine
 - o Challenge: there are very few NYS certified processors which some food banks require when accepting the deer meat donation

- License Sales
 - Sales are up
 - Habitat Stamp sales = 40-50,000/year
 - o Software system has an upsell feature
 - o Poster – new species for 2022 to be obtained by public vote
 - Suggestions for Venison Donation program: upsell Venison Donation, target License Sales Agents
- Filled Positions
 - Priority: stocking fish
 - Challenge: new standards for commercial driving licenses
- Regulatory Efforts (list carried over from January discussions)
 - Fishing Guide going out this week
 - o New printing vendor contract as of last year, at the mercy of low bid
 - Turkey

- Out 1.5 weeks ago in State Regulations
 - Comment period open until June 2022
 - Long Island proposals and conflicts
 - Larger shot
- Part 182 Regulations
- Canal Corp
 - More proactive and less reactive
 - Gobe work
- Capital Reports and Revenue Expenditure Reports (make this a standard agenda item)
 - Highlight/explain how resources are being used
- WSFR Quarterly Grant Reports
 - Available in July (end of year reports)
 - Meet quarterly, show if/what grants were received and how much spent
 - Wildlife restoration
 - 17-30 million
 - 7 million towards Hunter Education
 - Sport fishing: marine and freshwater
 - Capital fund not finished
 - Remain strategic in the use of funds
 - Cove Road
 - 1.6 million
 - Cost of doing business has increased tremendously
- Additional Updates
 - Lead ammunition
 - Has moved through all levels of approval, waiting for response from Chamber and the working group report
 - Shooting ranges
 - Tonawanda closed
 - Reasons: neighbor complaints, Seneca Nation's expressed concerns of lead contamination, EPA, 6-10 years of discussions
 - Why now: Part 51 (cannot target shoot on WMAs) became effective
 - Hunter Education
 - Range shooting discussions
 - In possession of and reviewing schematics of ranges in other states
 - Researching costs
 - Considering possible liability issues
 - Looking at WMAs
 - Considering "another Tonawanda" – updated, new and improved
 - Model Rhode Island ranges
 - 45 states use PR funds for ranges

- New regulations, shooting on WMAs
 - None – “except where designated” (we can designate)
 - No ranges on WMAs currently
- **Hartland Swamp WMA**
 - ❖ **FWL Niagra 18. Colosimo property, Seaman Road, Town of Hartland, Niagara County (SBL 42.00-1-3.1) ---- 115 acres**
 - ❖ **Appraisal is complete. Sent to Albany Real Property office for review on 11/9/2021. Central Office Real Property staff are reviewing the appraisal(s) and preparing a real property declaration (RPD) for this project. This is a step that can take quite some time since there are limited certified appraisers and several projects being reviewed at any one time. The property will be paid for with EPF (no federal).**
- Scriba Creek incident
 - Written statement from Council by next week
 - At one point, people were on hatchery land
 - Nation members helped to settle and defuse the situation
 - Barriers to be removed this week, by the end of May
 - Fish are gone
 - Hatchery is closed due to COVID
 - Responsibility to tax-paying, law-abiding citizens
 - Pursuing consultation

Division of Law Enforcement

- Staffing
 - 2008 – 337 officers (have not been at that number since)
 - 2016 – 298
 - 2022 – 20 officers from this year’s academy and 20+ expected to retire
 - (There was a difference in agreement on staffing numbers)
 - Increasing number of Forest Rangers
 - Civil service test – discontinued
 - 25-30 short for adequate staffing
 - Lieutenant numbers are good
 - Union issues for Captains – getting paid less than Lieutenants
 - Waiver currently in place for an Assistant Director
 - 2- or 4-year degree requirements is currently on the table for discussion

- 2-year degree if military experience, previous experience or have certain credits – discussions to relax this as a way to improve pool of applicant numbers
- Staffing improvement ideas: target audiences and get into the schools earlier
- Challenge:
 - o State land acquisitions (Region 5, for example) have created some Forest Ranger staffing issues
- Invasive Species enforcement
 - Being handled by check points, boat launch stewards, for example
 - Handled by Division of Lands and Forests in large part.
 - CFAB suggestions
 - o reach out to kids and schools with a 10- to 15-minute program for science classes addressing the impacts of invasive species
 - o Educating the population of folks coming into New York from other states by getting more messages out there about Invasive Species. This is proactive and could lessen the workload on the DLE side.
 - o Get wash stations installed at every boat launch
 - Inconsistencies in the bodies of water where these are located
- Important for law enforcement
 - Public Information Campaigns
 - Public compliance
- Work in progress
 - Academy – May 2022
 - Completed recruitment video
 - Recruitment and pools of candidates

Deputy Commissioner Steve Smith provided a letter that was written to the Commissioner regarding Division of Law Enforcement. Steve Smith stated that the letter sounded like it came from a lobbyist, Bill Connors would like it reflected in the minutes that he was offended that CFAB was referred to as lobbyists. Bill stated that this is a statutory board and that he will be putting this in writing to the Commissioner.
