<u>Update on DEC's E-Licensing system and sporting license sales:</u>

e-Licensing:

Status Summary and Activities Completed This Period

- Back-end batch program was run whereby remaining deer management permits were issued to hunters who did not receive first-choice DMPs in those WMUs that were under-subscribed. DMs were mailed out to hunters.
- First-come-first-served (FCFS) DMPs became available on November 1st in those WMUs that remain under-subscribed. Availability of FCFS DMPs is evaluated each night and shut off when quota is reached.
- System outage was experienced October 13th (1.5 hour) due to connectivity issues between Accela and NYS networks.
- DEC and ITS staff met and discussed roles, responsibilities, and approach to moving forward with RFP for DECALS and marine commercial licensing system.

License Sales

[please see detailed report – attached]

- Year-to-date revenues from license sales (\$38.4 million) are 1% greater than one year ago (\$321,000 more).
- October 2018 revenues were slightly greater than October 2017, but November 2018 sales have lagged that experienced in 2017.
- Compared to same period (August 1 through October 30) a year ago (attached):
 - o Resident muzzleloader privilege sales are up several thousand (2%),
 - Resident senior hunting licenses and senior muzzleloading privileges are up 4% and 8% respectively;
 - Non-resident fishing license sales (1-day, -day, and annual) continue to increase
 - o Resident hunting license sales are down a few thousand (but less than 1%)
 - Resident and non-resident junior hunting license sales are down approximately 8% and 5%, respectively.
- Monthly email reminders continue to be sent to previous license holders that have expiring or expired licenses (hunters and anglers) that have not, yet purchased a license for the new year

Status of Regulations (changes from previous month in bold):

Pending Proposals:

1) 6NYCRR Part 186 (new – Feeding of Wild White-tailed Deer and Moose) and Part 189 Chronic Wasting Disease. This proposal will adopt a new regulation (6 NYCRR Part 186) to prohibit the intentional feeding of wild deer and moose and the incidental feeding of wild deer and moose after warning from the Department, and require that products packaged to be sold as a food or attractant for deer or moose carry a clear label stating that such use is illegal in New York. Existing sections of Part 189 (189.3 [b] and [c]) pertaining to the feeding of deer will be removed to avoid confusion with Part 186. Additionally, we propose to formally define the application procedures and conditions for issuance of a 4-Poster permit for the use of 4-Poster Tickicide. Revised Notice of Proposed Rulemaking prepared and undergoing internal review.

- 2) 6 NYCRR: Part 151 Propagation and Sale of Fur-Bearing Animals, Part 153 Preserve Licenses, Part 170 Miscellaneous Licenses, Part 174 Sale of Live Birds, and Part 182 Endangered and Threatened Species of Fish and Wildlife; Species of Special Concern; Incidental Take Permits. The proposed rulemaking would: render regulations current with recent changes to multiple sections of the ECL, clarify and simplify licensing processes; reduce fees associated with several license types; and reduce the burden on the regulated community through time and cost savings and paperwork submissions. Revised Notice of Proposed Rulemaking prepared and undergoing internal review.
- 3) **6NYCRR Part 2.25 Hunting Upland Game Birds**. This proposed rulemaking would close to grouse hunting the portions of Franklin and St. Lawrence counties (portions of Wildlife Management Unit 6F) that are included in the spruce grouse recovery zone. *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking prepared and undergoing internal review.*
- 4) **6 NYCRR Part 1.31 Hunting black bear.** This proposed rulemaking would allow for early bear season in Wildlife Management Unit 4W to foster increased bear harvest in this management unit. *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking prepared and undergoing internal review.*

Emergency Rules:

1) **6NYCRR Part 189.3 Chronic Wasting Disease.** This emergency rule would prohibit importation of CWD-susceptible cervids from Quebec due to positive finding of CWD on captive facility in Quebec. *Notice of Emergency Rulemaking undergoing final review and awaiting publication.*

Status of DEC Hatchery System Infrastructure Work:

Updated table providing the status of DEC Hatchery projects funded via New York Works III, New York Works IV, New York Works V, New York Works VI and New York Works VII is attached.

Highlights:

- Re-bid for Caledonia Hatchery building rehabilitation, garage construction, and installation of fiberglass raceway projects due to no bidders on initial request.
- Bath Hatchery feed building insulation and windows installed.
- Paving projects at Bath Hatchery and South Otselic Hatchery awaiting start date from contractors.
- Contract awarded for potable water well investigation at Salmon River Hatchery.
- Salmon River Hatchery new boilers and heating system installed, unfortunately the new system does not function properly as boilers may be undersized.
- Adirondack Hatchery residence demolition paperwork submitted, model house chosen plans being revised.








Cumulative Sales by Date
